OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Representatives from DOE and BLM were present. Photographs are included with this report to illustrate the conditions observed.

The JD-9 Mine is located approximately twelve miles west of Naturita and accessed from FF16 road. The site is a 112d-1 operation that includes a total of 26.77 permitted acres.

There has been no recent activity at this site and overall conditions appear unchanged from the Division's previous inspections.

Upper Monogram Area

Vent fans and water treatment plant are located in this area. The water treatment plant is not currently in use. Pond liners are dilapidated and not functional. Water was not observed in any of the ponds. Conditions are similar to those observed during the Division's last inspection. No problems or violations were noted in this area.











Bull Canyon Area

This area consists of a collapsed portal, a metal building, waste rock pile and associated stormwater control structures. Overall, the area is well kept. Stormwater control structures appear to be maintained and functioning as designed. Conditions are similar to those observed during the Division's last inspection of this area. No problems or violations were noted.









On February 3, 2020, the operator notified the Division that the site was in final reclamation. On August 21, 2024, the Mined Land Reclamation Board granted an extension to the deadline to complete final reclamation. Reclamation is to be completed by March 1, 2030.
