OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Representatives from DOE and BLM were present. Photographs are included with this report to illustrate the conditions observed.

The JD-7 Pit is located approximately ten miles west of Naturita and accessed from EE17 Road. The site is a 112d-3 operation that includes a total of 504 permitted acres.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

Site activity has been limited to maintenance and cleanup. The pit floor and dump area appear well vegetated and stable. No stability issues were noted with the pit highwall.

On February 3, 2020, the operator notified the Division that the site was in final reclamation. On August 21, 2024, the Mined Land Reclamation Board granted an extension to the deadline to complete final reclamation. Reclamation is to be completed by March 1, 2030.
