OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the normal monitoring program established by the Colorado Division of Reclamation Mining and Safety's Active Mines Program. The San Juan Silver Project is listed as an active Notice of Intent to Conduct Prospecting Operations (NOI) located approximately 1 mile north of Creede, CO in Mineral County at an elevation of approximately 11,000 feet. This site consists of 2.1 acres to support exploratory drilling. Randy McClure, a representative of Rio Grande Silver, Inc. accompanied the inspection. The Division holds a \$5,826.00 Financial Warranty for the site. A reclamation cost estimate was not performed as a result of this inspection.

The NOI consists of 6 pads to support the drilling operation. Of those 6 pads, the only BD-6 has not been reclaimed. BD-1 through BD-4 and their associated road have been reclaimed. Vegetation is well established in the reclaimed area boulders have been placed to prevent disturbance from the public. No state listed invasive species were identified in the reclaimed area. Pad BD-5 was never constructed. Pad BD-6 has not yet been reclaimed. The access road continues past the pad to the Bulldog Project NOI. The BD-6 pad was being used for a water storage and transfer station for work at the Bulldog Project NOI but is not currently in use. The pad is leveled and cleared of vegetation. The cut slope on the western edge of the pad was stable and no evidence of settling, slumping or erosion was observed. The pad exhibits positive drainage and no impounded water was observed on the pad. The operator would like to keep the NOI open for further projects and does not intend to reclaim the pad at this time.

No problems or violations were noted or observed during the September 25, 2024 inspection.
