Excavation of Kleckner Lane will require approval by USFS on changes to FSR-633.

Areas of minimal disturbance will NOT be mined but will be minimally affected by measures to protect streams, control storm water, and ensure long-term stability. Phases A-E range in size from 2-3 acres, and depending on depth of deposit, will each take a year or less to mine and reclaim.
