Dear Mason Chamberlain:

On August 20, 2024, the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division/DRMS) considered the Construction Materials Reclamation Permit Conversion application (CN-1) for the Falk Pit #1, located in Phillips County, complete and filed. This adequacy review addresses an issue observed during the per-operation inspection conducted on October 22, 2024. Please address the following item in a letter that also addresses the deficiencies outlined in the adequacy review from DRMS dated October 4, 2024.

Exhibit D: Reclamation Plan

1. During the inspection of the permitted area conducted by the Division on October 22, 2024, common mullein was observed to be growing on land that had been disturbed by past mining operations. Common mullein is listed as a class C noxious weed species with the Colorado Department of Agriculture. There is not a weed management plan in the current permit file for the mining and reclamation operation. Please include a weed management plan in the CN-1 application in accordance with Rule 6.4.5(2)(c) and Rule 3.1.10(6). This plan should be developed in consultation with the county extension agency or weed control district office and should include specific control measures to be applied, a schedule for when control measures will be applied and a post-treatment monitoring plan.

This concludes the Division's #1b adequacy review of the CN-1 application for the Falk Pit #1. The decision date for the CN-1 application is scheduled for **December 15, 2024.** Please respond in a timely manner to allow the Division about two weeks to review the responses to the issue outlined here and issues outlined in the adequacy review dated October 4, 2024. If more time is required to address all items, a written request for an extension of the decision date must be submitted before **December 15, 2024.** Please be advised that the CN-1 application may be deemed inadequate and denied on **December 15, 2024.** if the deficient items have not been addressed to the Division's satisfaction.
