OBSERVATIONS

The Phillips County Landfill Pit was inspected by Joel Renfro with the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division/DRMS) on December 17, 2024. Kevin Scott, Ed Glennemeier, and Dave Salyards with Phillips County were present during the inspection. Access to this site is from the east of Co Rd 29. **Photos 1-8** taken during the inspection are included with this report.

This is a 112c operation permitted for clay, sand, and gravel which is used in county road maintenance. This site is managed by Phillips County. The post-mining land use is wildlife habitat. The permit boundary for this site is 47.10 acres, which is the same as the maximum allowed affected acreage.

This site is located directly south of the Phillips County Landfill, and they share a boundary on the south of the landfill. These operations do not overlap with one another. The permit boundary for this site is delineated by markers in each of the corners, along with markers along the boundary shared by the landfill and the mining operation.

The pit for this site is in a dried creek bed just southeast of the Phillips County landfill. It has been about 3 years since this site was last active. According to the operator, there isn't much more material worth excavating at this site and they might be considering digging new pits within the permit boundary. Particularly, the field south within the southern permit boundary is of interest to possibly expand. Please see the attached mining plan map, which shows the current permit boundary and confirms that this field is within the permit boundary. Any new pits within the permit boundary would require a technical revision to the mining and reclamation plan since the current plan only approves the mining and reclamation of a single pit.

This operation appears to be following their mining plan and no problems or violations were observed during the inspection.
