OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present. Photographs are included with this report to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Mott Gravel Pit is located approximately five miles south of Crawford and accessed from Clear Fork Road. The site is a 110c operation that includes a total of 9.74 permitted acres.

Pursuant to Rule 4.1.2 (2), a financial warranty is not required for this site.

Adequate mine identification signage was posted on the gate at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by fencing and posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

Mining was not occurring during this inspection. Crushed gravel stockpiles are located in the storage area on the north side of the pit. The pit currently covers approximately three acres. The pit is approximately twenty feet in depth, with a near vertical highwall that spans the perimeter of the pit, approximately 1,400 linear feet. Overburden is stockpiled above the southeast rim of the pit. The salvaged topsoil is stockpiled in a berm along the west side of the pit. No erosional concerns were noted. A scale and scale house are located on the west side of the pit.

No problems related to disturbance of the prevailing hydrologic balance were noted. The operation has not exposed groundwater.

There are no processing facilities on site, and thus no processing waste.

Fuels or toxic materials are not stored on site. Acid generating materials are not exposed by the mining operation.

No offsite damage was noted.

Explosives are not used for this mining operation.

Mining is ongoing and final reclamation has not yet commenced.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
