Re: Notice of Filing Deficiencies, 110(1) Reclamation Permit Application Three Toes Mine, File No. M-2025-008

Dear Brent Rovedo,

On February 18, 2025, the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) received your Hardrock Limited Impact Operation 110(1) Reclamation Permit Application for the proposed Three Toes Mine operation in Teller County and assigned it File No. M-2025-008. Pursuant to Rule 1.4.1(8), the Division has determined the application contains deficiencies which prevent the application from being considered filed. Please respond to this Notice of Filing Deficiencies with the requested information and summarize each response to the numbered items below, in a cover letter titled "Response to Notice of Filing Deficiencies, M-2025-008".

Application Form:

- 1. The details provided for the Location Information (Question 10, Page 3) was incomplete. Please ensure all location details are provided including the miles and direction from the nearest town and the approximate elevation of the site and resubmit Page 3.
- 2. Responsibility #10 (Page 6) was initialed however, the Applicant/Operator appears to not be a Joint Venture or Partnership. Please revise Page 6 accordingly.

EXHIBIT G – Source of Legal Right-to-Enter (Rule 6.3.7):

3. Please provide documentation of the Applicant's legal right to enter as required by Rule 6.3.7. Based on the information provided in Exhibit G, the documentation to cover the surface legal right to enter should be an Approved or Conditionally Approved Mine Plan of Operations (MPO or POO) from the United States Forest Service (USFS) while the subsurface legal right to enter should be documentation from the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) showing Brent Rovedo is the registered claimant for CMC 282000.

EXHIBIT I – Proof of Filing with County Clerk (Rule 6.3.9):

4. In accordance with Rule 1.6.2(2), please submit proof that the revisions associated with this letter have been placed for public review with the original application at the local County Clerk and Recorder. This may be an affidavit, receipt, or electronic confirmation from the local County Clerk and Recorder.

Your 110(1) Permit Application will not be considered filed until the information listed above is received and found sufficient to begin our review. A decision date will be established 30 days from the date of receipt and acceptance of all the requested information. Pursuant to Rule 1.4.1(8), you have 60 days from the date of this letter to submit all necessary documents that the Division needs for an application to be considered filed. If, at the end of the sixty-day period, the application has not been determined to be filed with the Division, the Division may deny the application



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and terminate the application file. The response to this Notice of Filing Deficiencies is due on or before April 22, 2025.

This letter shall not be interpreted to mean that there are no other deficiency or adequacy requirements in your application. The Division will review your application to determine whether it is adequate to meet the requirements of the Act and Rules after submittal of all required items.
