Mr. Regan:

On March 10, 2025, the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division/DRMS) received the 112 Construction Materials New Permit Application for the Section 25 Sand Mine, File No. M-2025-015. Preliminary review of the application determined the following items must be received before the Division can consider the application as being submitted/filed and the technical review can begin. Please respond to this Incompleteness Notice with the requested additional/updated information on permit application replacement pages and summarize each response in a cover letter titled "Incompleteness Response; M-2025-015".

APPLICATION FORM:

1. Incidental commodities to be mined: On the first page Section 5.1 and 5.3, Incidental commoditie(s) and anticipated end use of incidental commoditie(s) to be mined, were left blank. Please indicate type, quantity and end use of material that will be incidentally mined at the site or if none are expected please clearly indicate with "NA". Please submit a replacement page one of the application form.
2. Location Information. On page two, item 9, the quarter and quarter/quarter sections were left blank, please check one that best fits the proposed operation. Please submit a replacement page two of the application form.
3. On-Site Processing. On page 4, item 15, the last question in this series was left blank. Please clearly state, here, if any designated chemicals or acid-producing materials will be used or stored within the permit area, if there will be none, please state so. No need to resubmit page 4.



EXHIBIT R – Proof of Filing with County Clerk and Recorder (Rule 6.4.18):

4. Pursuant to Rule 1.6.2(1)(c), please demonstrate that the Applicant has placed a copy of the Applicant's response to these incompleteness issues have been placed with the application materials previously placed with the County Clerks or Recorders Offices and made available for public review.

Your new permit application will not be considered filed until the information listed above is received and found sufficient to begin our review. A decision date will be established 90 days from the date of receipt and acceptance of all the requested information. Additionally, if you have already published notice you will need to republish notice, but only after the Division considers the application complete and filed. The Division will notify you when you should initiate publication of your notice. This notice must be published once a week for four (4) consecutive weeks, starting ten (10) days of the date, your application is considered filed. The final date for receiving comments is the twentieth (20th) day after the fourth publication.

Pursuant to Rule 1.4.1(8), you have sixty (60) days from the date of this letter to submit all necessary documents that the Division needs for an application to be considered filed. If, at the end of the sixty-day period, the application has not been determined to be filed with the Division, the Division may deny the application and terminate the application file. Should additional time be required to submit all the necessary documents an extension request can be submitted in writing for consideration by the Division.

The response to this Incompleteness Notice is due on or before May 17, 2025.

This letter shall not be interpreted to mean that there are no other completeness issues or technical deficiencies in your application. The Division will review your application to determine whether it is adequate to meet the requirements of the Act after submittal of all required items.
