COMMENTS

This was a partial inspection of the Hayden Gulch Loadout conducted by Brock Bowles with the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining, and Safety (Division). Twentymile Coal, LLC. (TC) was informed of the inspection but declined to attend. The weather at the time of the inspection was clear and warm. The snow had melted across the disturbed area and there was standing water in many sections of the reclamation.

Water was flowing in the ditches from east to west across the reclamation on the south side of Hwy 40 (photo 1). The ditch on the north side of Hwy 40 was dry (photo 2).

The ditch along the railroad main-line contained water.

REVEGETATION – Rule 4.15

Vegetative Cover; Timing:

The snow had melted from most of the site except on the small slope leading up to the trailhead parking lot (photo 3).

The above ground vegetation was dead or dormant. No sprouting was seen, although it is still early in the season.
