## **COMMENTS**

This was a complete inspection by Leigh Simmons of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division). The weather was overcast but dry, with patches of snow on the ground in shaded areas. The mine was active. The inspection was accompanied by Natalie Stafford and Josh Thompson of Mountain Coal Company (MCC).

## AVAILABILITY OF RECORDS – Rule 5.02.4(1):

Records were available using a public access laptop in the small conference room at the mine office. Details are given at the end of this report.

The ATFE permit has expired. Please update the file with a copy of the renewed permits, or the notice of administrative extension.

Please also ensure that all records added to the thumb drive are in a .pdf format, since the public access laptop cannot be used to open .xls files.

### **HYDROLOGIC BALANCE - Rule 4.05**

Drainage Control 4.05.1, 4.05.2, 4.05.3; Siltation Structures 4.05.5, 4.05.6; Discharge Structures 4.05.7, 4.05.10; Diversions 4.05.4; Effluent Limits 4.05.2; Ground Water Monitoring 4.05.13; Surface Water Monitoring 4.05.13; Drainage – Acid and Toxic Materials 4.05.8; Impoundments 4.05.6, 4.05.9; Stream Buffer Zones 4.05.18:

Ditches and culverts around the facilities area were clean and in good order.

Sediment ponds SG1, RPE, MB3 and MB5E were holding water, but not discharging. No issues were observed with liners, embankments and discharge structures.

### GENERAL MINE PLAN COMPLIANCE:

Longwall mining of the LWE16 panel was in progress, at around cross cut 9 on the head gate.

Three development crews were working: in the B26 tail gate at around cross-cut 33, in the B26 head gate at around cross-cut 56, and in the B27 head gate at around cross-cut 31.

Contractors with Phoenix Mining continued to work on pillaring of the Sunset Mains, the job was nearing completion.

### PROCESSING WASTE/COAL MINE WASTE PILES - Rule 4.10 and 4.11

Drainage Control; Surface Stabilization; Placement:

No waste had recently been transported to the RPEE, but the road was passable in a light truck. The surface of the waste pile was smooth, compact and graded to drain to the north west, but the surface material was still wet and no attempt was made to drive onto it. The recently reclaimed outslopes of the pile were in good shape after the winter, with no obvious signs of erosion. Straw wattles had remained in place.

Some processing waste was being generated in order to satisfy particularly stringent shipping requirements and was being temporarily stockpiled on the RPE.

Stockpiled coal fines continued to be drawn down, with an estimated 53,000 tons remaining. MCC planned to clear the site of fines by the end of the summer.

#### **SUPPORT FACILITIES - Rule 4.04:**

The project to line silo 2 was in progress, with 5-6 concrete trucks arriving at the site per day. The liner had been constructed up to around 48 feet.




Figure 1: Mine map showing longwall progress in LWE16




Figure 2: Mine map showing B-seam development progress
