Please see the following responses to your Follow-Up Incompleteness Notice concerns of September 23, 2019.

1. Items 5.1/5.3. On page one the incidental commodities to be mined was incorrectly filled out. Please indicate the type and volume of incidental commodities to be mined (5.1) or if no incidental commodities will be mined, please indicate "N/A" on 5.1 and "N/A" on the associated line on 5.3. Please submit a replacement page one of the application form.

Please see the attached and updated 'Construction112App - Bradford Mesa 190924.pdf.'

2. Item 10. On page two the mine entrance location given does not match the mine entrance coordinates given in Exhibit A. Please update the information with the coordinate given in Exhibit A and submit a replacement page two of the application form.

Please see the attached and updated 'Construction112App – Bradford Mesa 190924.pdf.' The incorrect mine entry location was a relic from before your Incompleteness Notice dated August 27, 2019 where the haul road was entered into the permit boundary.

3. Certification. The notary section does not contain the complete company name, Southway Construction Company, Inc. of Alamosa, but instead lists Southway Const. Co. Inc. Please update this section with the complete company name and submit a replacement Certification page.

An original signed and notarized application form 'Construction112App – Bradford Mesa 190924' is en route to the DRMS Denver office in hard copy.




Figure 3. Map of the Edmundson Ranch haul road and Boulder Pick-up roads shown in orange. County Road 120 is shown in gray. Lower image is unannotated. Imagery dated 151014 from GoogleEarth.

4. The applicant revised the permit boundary to include existing ranch roads that will be utilized to transport material to CR 120/121. In Figure 3 on page D-12 there is a portion of a road that leads to the boulder pick-up area that was excluded from the revised permit boundary. Please revise the permit boundary to include this road or provide a suitable explanation for not including this segment of road into the permit boundary.

Please see the attached and updated 'DRMS Bradford Mesa Quarry 190924 Follow-up Incompleteness D12.pdf.' The previous orange outline of the boulder pick-up road was incorrectly placed outside the permit boundary due to the resolution of the image used during haul road tracing; the mileage labels of all haul roads are still correct. Regardless, maps C-1, C-2, C-3 and F-1 of the August 28, 2019 submittal resulting from your Incompleteness Notice dated August 27, 2019 all show the boulder pick-up road as within the permit boundary.

5. Please provide an affidavit or receipt indicating the date on which the application was placed with the local County Clerk and Recorder for public review, pursuant to Rule 1.6.2(1)(c).

This receipt was shared with you via email on September 19, 2019 where you responded that the receipt would be included in the package you received the day before. Regardless, please find the attached 'Clerk Letter – signed 190918.pdf.'

Responsibilities as a Permittee:

Upon application approval and permit issuance, this application becomes a legally binding document. Therefore, there are a number of important requirements which you, as a permittee, should fully understand. These requirements are listed below. Please read and initial each requirement, in the space provided, to acknowledge that you understand your obligations. If you do not understand these obligations then please contact this Office for a full explanation.

1. Your obligation to reclaim the site is not limited to the amount of the financial warranty. You assume legal liability for all reasonable expenses which the Board or the Office may incur to reclaim the affected lands associated with your mining operation in the event your permit is revoked and financial warranty is forfeited;

2. The Board may suspend or revoke this permit, or assess a civil penalty, upon a finding that the permittee violated the terms or conditions of this permit, the Act, the Mineral Rules and Regulations, or that information contained in the application or your permit misrepresent important material facts;

3. If your mining and reclamation operations affect areas beyond the boundaries of an approved permit boundary, substantial civil penalties, to you as permittee can result;

4. Any modification to the approved mining and reclamation plan from those described in your approved application requires you to submit a permit modification and obtain approval from the Board or Office;

5. It is your responsibility to notify the Office of any changes in your address or phone number;

6. Upon permit issuance and prior to beginning on-site mining activity, you must post a sign at the entrance of the mine site, which shall be clearly visible from the access road, with the following information (Rule 3.1.12):

- a. the name of the operator;
- b. a statement that a reclamation permit for the operation has been issued by the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Board; and,
- c. the permit number.

7. The boundaries of the permit boundary area must be marked by monuments or other markers that are clearly visible and adequate to delineate such boundaries prior to site disturbance.

8. It is a provision of this permit that the operations will be conducted in accordance with the terms and conditions listed in your application, as well as with the provisions of the Act and the Construction Material Rules and Regulations in effect at the time the permit is issued.

9. Annually, on the anniversary date of permit issuance, you must submit an annual fee as specified by Statute, and an annual report which includes a map describing the acreage affected and the acreage reclaimed to date (if there are changes from the previous year), any monitoring required by the Reclamation Plan to be submitted annually on the anniversary date of the permit approval. Annual fees are for the previous year a permit is held. For example, a permit with the anniversary date of July 1, 1995, the annual fee is for the period of July 1, 1994 through June 30, 1995. Failure to submit your annual fee and report by the permit anniversary date may result in a civil penalty, revocation of your permit, and forfeiture of your financial warranty. It is your responsibility, as the permittee, to continue to pay your annual fee to the Office until the Board releases you from your total reclamation responsibility.

10. <u>For joint venture/partnership operators</u>: the signing representative is authorized to sign this document and a power of attorney (provided by the partner(s)) authorizing the signature of the representative is attached to this application.

NOTE TO COMMENTORS/OBJECTORS:

It is likely there will be additions, changes, and deletions to this document prior to final decision by the Office. Therefore, if you have any comments or concerns you must contact the applicant or the Office prior to the decision date so that you will know what changes may have been made to the application document.

The Office is not allowed to consider comments, unless they are written, and received prior to the end of the public comment period. You should contact the applicant for the final date of the public comment period.
