OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Cory Glover, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Bellgardt Pit is located approximately 8.5 miles east of Montrose and accessed from Hwy 50. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 36 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$50,213.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is sufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

Approximately eight acres are currently disturbed by the operation. The highwall is on the north side of the pit and is mostly graded to 2H:1V. A gravel stockpile was located in the east side of the pit floor. Topsoil was stockpiled on the south side of the pit. The pit floor is free of trash and debris.

No issues related to stormwater or erosion control were noted.

There was no processing equipment on site.

Fuels were not stored on site. Acid generating materials have not been exposed by the mine operation.

Explosives are not used for this operation.

The access road is well maintained.

No noxious weed infestations were noted.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
