OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Conger Harvesting Area is located approximately 1.5 miles west of Marble and accessed from CR-3. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 25.65 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$7,725 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is insufficient. The Operator was notified under separate cover of a financial warranty increase on February 26, 2025.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by t-posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

This is an intermittent operation. The access road, approved through AM-1, has been constructed and appeared well maintained. The current disturbance is small, approximately 1 acre including the excavation area and the portion of access road from the USFS boundary. When operating, the operation performs concurrent reclamation. The access road from CR3 up to the USFS boundary will remain post reclamation. Reclamation slopes are to be 2:1 or flatter. There is little to no topsoil available in the rock harvesting areas. Rock slopes around the disturbed area appear stable.

No issues related to stormwater or erosion control were noted.

Equipment or fuels are not stored on site. Acid generating materials have not been exposed by the operation.

Explosives are not used by this operation.

No noxious weed infestations were noted.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
