OBSERVATIONS

The Laster Pit was inspected by Joel Renfro with the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety on March 25, 2025 as a part of the Divisions regular monitoring program. Kacey Campbell and Bob Coty with Sedgwick County Road and Bridge were present during the inspection. The Laster Pit is located approximately 2 miles south of Julesburg, CO in Sedgwick County. The weather was clear at the time of inspection. **Photos 1-5** taken during the inspection are included with this report.

This is a 112c operation permitted for mining gravel. This operation was recently permitted in July of 2024. The permit area is 28.7 acres, and the post-mine land use is rangeland.

During the inspection, the site was not active, however, significant progress has been made. The beginnings of a pit floor were observed, with substantial overburden material pushed to the sides of the area. According to the operator, material extraction has yet to begin as they are currently in the process of locating gravel.

A well-managed dirt road provides access to the site, with the entrance located to the north, just past the county landfill. The road appeared to be in good condition.

This operation is planned to work in 3 phases of gravel mining over the next 20 years. Siltation ponds are planned to be built downslope of mined areas to collect any sediment from extreme rainfall. No ponds were observed during the inspections, but the site is still in its early stages.
