OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Nicholas Pit is located approximately 6.5 miles southeast of Cimarron and accessed from CR 864. The site is a 110c operation that includes a total of 7.72 permitted acres. Pursuant to Rule 4.1.2, a financial warranty is not required for this site because the Operator is a unit of county government.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by fencing that was clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

Evidence of any recent excavation was not noted. There is no equipment stored on-site. The pit, located in the south part of the permit area, covers approximately 2.5 acres. The pit daylights to the west. The highwall on the east side of the pit, approximately 700 linear feet at 10-15 feet in height, has been graded to approximately 2H:1V. The area on the north side of the pit is a level, graveled area for staging/stockpile storage. There were no stockpiles on-site during this inspection.

Disturbances to the hydrologic balance were not noted. There was no standing water observed in the pit. Issues related to erosion or stormwater control were not noted.

There was no processing equipment or processing waste on-site.

Fuels or toxic materials are not stored on-site. The operation has not exposed toxic or acid-forming materials.

Explosives are not used for this operation.

Noxious weed infestations were not noted.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
