# **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Schmalz Construction Pit is located approximately two miles northwest of Gunnison and accessed from CR17. The site is a 110c operation that includes a total of 9.8 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$21,654.00 for this site. The Division will review the reclamation costs in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan. The Operator will be notified under separate cover if the Division determines that the current financial warranty amount is insufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by posts that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

There has been little change at the site since the Division's last inspection. There are approximately four acres currently disturbed by the operation. The highwall along the west end of the pit is approximately 10'-12' high. Material has sloughed from the highwall resulting in an approximately 0.5H:1V slope. Several topsoil stockpiles were noted around the perimeter of the pit, and various product piles within the pit. The topsoil piles appear stable and protected from erosion due to a significant amount of vegetation from native volunteer species.

No problems related to stormwater or erosion control were noted.

No problems regarding disturbance of the hydrologic balance were noted. Groundwater has not been exposed at the site.

There was no mining or processing equipment stored within the permit area. Fuels are not stored on site. Acid generating materials have not been exposed by the operation.

Explosives are not used for this operation.

No noxious weed infestations were noted.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
