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GENERAL INSPECTION TOPICS

This list identifies the environmental and permit parameters inspected and gives a categorical evaluation of each. No problems or possible violations were noted during the inspection. The mine operation was found to be in full compliance with Mineral Rules and Regulations of the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Board for the Extraction of Construction Materials and/or for Hard Rock, Metal and Designated Mining Operations. OBSERVATIONS

The Munroe Gypsum Quarry was inspected by Joel Renfro with the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division/DRMS) on April 24, 2025 in response to an acreage reduction request (AR-2), which was filed on March 12, 2025. Dana Mellage was present during the inspection and represented Colorado Lien Company. **Photos 1-16** taken during the inspection are included with this report.

The Munroe Gypsum Quarry is a 112c operation permitted for the extraction of gypsum. The permit area is 240 acres, with 70.7 acres of allowed disturbance. The current active mining is in the southern permit area, but there are two other areas identified in the northern permit area that have been identified as areas that will be mined in the future.

Although this inspection was mainly focused on the portions of the site requested to be released, the Division did observe the active mining pit along with some recent reclamation work that the operator began work on last year. The site was not active at the time of inspection, but the active mining area had recently been blasted. The area south of the active mining is currently in reclamation. The reclaimed slopes appeared to be graded to 3H:1V or steeper and had been seeded. Some new growth was observed during the inspection.

In AR-2, 13.4 acres were requested to be released from the permit area. This release request includes two areas that are located north of the active mining area. One release block is 1.4 acres and south of the access road, and another block is 12 acres and north of the access road.

It's estimated that these areas have been in reclamation for nearly 10 years now. Most of the vegetation in the release areas is comprised of native rabbit brush with an understory of native grasses. It is still early in the growing season, so most of the vegetation on site is either dormant or just starting to show signs of new growth. This site is approximately 6000 feet in elevation, well within the foothills. The climate in these regions trends towards cool temperatures and high precipitation. Based on these climate factors and the vegetation throughout the surrounding area, it appears that short grasses and sparse shrubs are what to expect in this area, which is generally what was observed in the reclaimed areas. No noxious weeds were observed during the inspection.

About 12 acres were requested to be released in the northern release block just north of the access road. This area gradually inclines from the access road and is a mostly south-facing slope. The vegetation appeared well established and self-sustaining. It was observed that this block appears to be consistent with the vegetative cover of the surrounding area during the inspection and on satellite imagery. Most of the vegetation in this area was made up of perennial, native plants, and the lack of noxious weeds, nuisance weeds, or abundant annuals suggests that this is a self-sustaining ecosystem. Based on these observations, the Division will be releasing the 12-acre block.

The southern 1.4-acre release block looked similar to the northern block, comprised mostly of rabbit brush with short native grasses throughout the understory. This block slopes down from the road, and it appears that water drains into this area. The vegetation appeared more dense and the rabbit brush were larger than the ones found in the northern block. However, this block is much closer to the active mining boundary. This release block, while appearing reclaimed, is also affected by the nearby mining. The southern boundary of the release block has been mined directly up to, and material from the mined slope is falling into the release block. Additionally, the active pit has been, and will be, blasted to loosen up mined material. Some fly rock was observed during the inspection on the access road to the site, past the release block, as well as some smaller fly rock within the block. If this block were to be released, any future disturbance that impacts this block would be classified as off-site damage and could be subject to a possible violation. None of this is an issue at the moment since the

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block is within the permit boundary. Because of the proximity to the active mining and high risk for future offsite damage, the Division will not approve the release of these 1.4 acres.

The areas requested to be released are in the middle of the permit area. The shape of the permit boundary will not change on the outskirts of the boundary, but rather in the middle of the permit area. Please note that once the release of the 12-acre block is finalized, the Division will require a technical revision submitted to our office to officially update the mining and reclamation plan maps since this approval inherently changes these maps and plans. Within the technical revision, please describe or show how this released area will be marked since the permit boundary needs to be marked as detailed in Rule 3.1.12(2).

Based on the observations made during this inspection, the request for an acreage reduction for the 12 acres north of the access road will be approved. The request for an acreage reduction for the 1.4 acres south of the access road will be denied. This release of 12 acres will reduce the permit area to **228 acres** from 240 acres.

Notice of the Division's decision regarding the release request will be sent under a separate cover letter.
