Dear Jocelyn,

In response to your adequacy review letter dated May 22, 2025, we are providing the following answers:

- Item #1: The stockpiled materials will be removed prior to any reclamation of the affected lands. We do not anticipate reclamation operations in the near future, as we are a long ways off from beginning reclamation. We are not intending to use any of the stockpiled material to backfill during reclamation activities once that process begins.
- Item #1 c.: A signed affidavit certifying the stockpiled material is clean and inert in accordance with Rule 3.1.5 (9) (c) is included in this response. We will not be backfilling with imported material, we are only storing non-toxic material at the site.

## RE: Dist No. 2 Gravel Pit, Permit No. M-1979-216; Technical Revision (TR-1), Adequacy Review

Dear Mr. Hileman,

On May 7, 2025, the Division of Reclamation, Mining, and Safety (Division/DRMS) received the Technical Revision (TR-1) application to update the mining plan to include stockpiling of imported material on the permitted area of the Fremont Gravel Pit, located in Fremont County. After a review of the application, there are some matters that require further information and/or clarification prior to the Division issuing a decision for the TR-1 application. Please provide a response and any supplemental items in a cover letter addressing the following items.

- 1. The materials being requested to have stockpiled at the permitted site include culverts, cattle guards, guard rails, tree limbs/branches, fill material, and concrete. These materials are not acid-forming or toxic in nature, as stated in the letter from the Fremont County Department of Transportation. Will the materials be removed from the site prior to reclamation of the affected lands? If the intention is to use any imported materials as backfill during reclamation activities, please provide the following information, per Rule 3.1.5(9):
  - a. A narrative that describes the approximate location of where imported material will be used as backfill, per Rule 3.1.5(9)(a).
  - b. The approximate volume of the imported material to be used as backfill, per Rule 3.1.5(9)(b).
  - c. A signed affidavit certifying that the material is clean and inert in accordance with Rule 3.1.5(9)(c). Be advised, the letter provided from the Fremont County Department of Transportation is not signed and does not satisfy this requirement.
  - d. An explanation of how the backfilled site will result in a post-mining configuration that is compatible with the approved post-mining land use, per Rule 3.1.5(9)(e).

This concludes the Division's adequacy review of the TR-1 application for the Fremont Gravel Pit. The decision date for the TR-1 application is <u>June 6, 2025</u>. If more time is needed to


As defined by the Minerals Rules, a Technical Revision (TR) is: "a change in the permit or application which does not have more than a minor effect upon the approved or proposed Reclamation or Environmental Protection Plan." The Division is charged with determining if the revision as submitted meets this definition. If the Division determines that the proposed revision is beyond the scope of a TR, the Division may require the submittal of a permit amendment to make the required or desired changes to the permit.

The request for a TR is not considered "filed for review" until the appropriate fee is received by the Division (as listed below by permit type). Please submit the appropriate fee with your request to expedite the review process. After the TR is submitted with the appropriate fee, the Division will determine if it is approvable within 30 days. If the Division requires additional information to approve a TR, you will be notified of specific deficiencies that will need to be addressed. If at the end of the 30 day review period there are still outstanding deficiencies, the Division must deny the TR unless the permittee requests additional time, in writing, to provide the required information.

There is no pre-defined format for the submittal of a TR; however, it is up to the permittee to provide sufficient information to the Division to approve the TR request, including updated mining and reclamation plan maps that accurately depict the changes proposed in the requested TR.
