Corrective Action Extension Request and Update

Dear Ms. Armstrong:

General Shale Brick, Inc. (GSB) is in receipt of the Minerals Inspection Report for the Dawson Mine dated February 13, 2025. The inspection noted 3 problems:

INSPECTION TOPIC: Sediment Control

PROBLEM #1: Erosion rills and gullies were observed throughout the portion of the permit area that lies south of the access road, including a significant erosion feature that's present on the southern highwall of the East Pit.

This is a problem at this time for failure to protect the affected land from erosion pursuant to C.R.S. 34-32.5-116

(4)(j) and Rule 3.1.6(3).

CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: The operator shall provide photo documentation to the Division verifying erosion gullies and ruts have been repaired, and that the site has have been reconstructed and stabilized to prevent erosion damage by the corrective action date.

Response:

GSB is respectfully requesting an extension of the due date of June 3, 2025 to July 3, 2025. The reason for this extension is due to the current weather pattern of rain every other day in late May and early June. Our current plan is to mobilize heavy equipment to the Dawson Mine in early June and perform the repairs.

INSPECTION TOPIC: Revegetation

PROBLEM #2: There are state-listed noxious weeds present on site, including common mullein, knapweed, and thistle. This is a problem for failure to employ weed control methods for state listed noxious weed species within the permitted area, and to reduce the spread of weeds to nearby areas as required by Rule 3.1.10(6).

CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: The operator shall implement the approved weed control plan and provide proof to the Division that this has been done by the corrective action date. If a weed control plan is not already in place, the operator shall develop a weed control and management plan in accordance with Rule 3.1.10(6). This plan should be developed in consultation with the county extension agency or weed control district office, and should include specific control measures to be applied, a schedule for when control measures will be applied and a posttreatment monitoring plan. This weed control plan shall be submitted to the Division as a Technical Revision to the approved plan with the appropriate Technical Revision fee of \$216.00 by the corrective action date.



Response:

The Dawson Mine has been sprayed for weeds on May 27, 2025. Please see attached invoice from Falcon Weed Control.

INSPECTION TOPIC: Financial Warranty

PROBLEM #3: The financial warranty is not adequate to reclaim the site in accordance with the approved reclamation plan. This is a failure to maintain the proper financial warranty amount to complete reclamation of the affected lands pursuant to C.R.S. 34-32.5-117(4)(b) and Rule 4.2.1(1). **CORRECTIVE ACTIONS:** The operator shall review the enclosed bond estimate and provide any comments or proof of reclamation completed by the corrective action date. If, by the corrective action date, no comments have been received, the Division will send a separate surety increase notice to the operator regarding the increase of the financial warranty. The operator will have 60 days from the date on the surety increase notice to post the additional financial warranty

Response:

The bond increase was placed in the mail to the Division on May 28, 2025. GSB is respectfully requesting an extension of the due date of June 3, 2025 to July 3, 2025. The reason for this extension is to allow the Division to review and approve the surety bond increase and make changes as necessary.
