Questionnaire**

Dear Caroline Bennett,

On June 4, 2025, the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) received your "Is It Mining" questionnaire concerning a proposed project to crush approximately 1,556.3 cubic yards of river rock cobble into road base. The questionnaire indicated that the material was previously extracted by a prior landowner for the construction of a storage pond, and the current landowner intends to either use the material on the ranch property or sell it.

The Mined Land Reclamation Board has directed the Division to determine if a Mined Land Reclamation Permit is required for this project. Based on the information provided in the questionnaire, the Division has determined that a permit is *not* required if the material is used exclusively on the current property and is *not* sold or transported to a different location.

However, should the material be sold and/or hauled off-site, a permit will be necessary. Specifically, either a 111(1)(b) permit or a 110c permit would be required if the current owner plans to process and sell the material.

If you disagree with this determination, you have the right to petition to appear before the Board for a formal public hearing to request a Declaratory Order. Pursuant to Rule 2.5.2(1), your written request must be received by the Board no later than 7 days prior to the hearing and must include the information outlined in Rule 2.5.2(2). The next scheduled Board hearing will be held on June 18, 2025, at 1313 Sherman St., Room 318, Denver, Colorado 80203.
