Hi Jason,

Per your request received today, I'm extending Problem #1 (right of entry) and Problem #2 corrective action due dates for the Buffalo No 1 (M-1978-011) from 6/29/2025 to 9/27/2025.

We don't have a generic form for the letter from landowner, but it should include the following:

- That they are the owner of the land.
 - The legal description of the site location.
 - Language along the line of: "At such a time when said lease agreement is finalized, General Shale Brick, Inc. has my permission to begin mining and reclamation activities on the property listed above."
- OR
- Language along the line of: "The purpose of this letter is to verify that General Shale Brick, Inc. has my authorization to complete mining and reclamation activities located on the above described property"
 - The landowner's contact information and their signature.
 - Acknowledged by a Notary Public.

Also just for reference:

Rule 6.4.14 Source of Legal Right to Enter

Provide documentation of the legal right to enter to conduct mining and reclamation, for Owners of Record described in Rule 1.6.2(1)(e)(i). This may include a copy of a lease, deed, abstract of title, a current tax receipt, or a signed statement by the Landowner and acknowledged by a Notary Public stating that the Operator/Applicant has legal right to enter to conduct mining and reclamation.
