Southwest Ready Mix would like to be proactive in reclaiming the Alamosa Pit No. 2 (Swift Pit). Southwest Ready Mix would like to begin backfilling activities at this site with imported inert materials during this Amendment process. As per the Division's definition of inert material below:

"Inert Material" means non-water-soluble and non-putrescible solids together with such minor amounts and types of other materials, unless such materials are acid or toxic producing, as will not significantly affect the inert nature of such solids. The term includes, but is not limited to, earth, sand, gravel, rock, concrete which has been in a hardened state for at least sixty (60) days, masonry, asphalt paving fragments, and other inert solids.

Southwest Ready Mix commits to using only this type of material for backfill as well as documenting and certifying that all backfill material meets this requirement and providing the Division regular updates with this data.

Allowing this reclamation activity during the amendment process will allow for the site's continued remediation without being delayed any further. The amendment process can take several months, which we believe would be valuable time to work simultaneously to get the site into compliance.
