OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the normal monitoring program established by the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division). The inspection was conducted by Leigh Simmons of the Division together with John Lee of the US Forest Service (USFS).

The Compromise Mine is permitted as a silver prospecting operation, with an affected area of approximately 1/2 an acre, located at 39.1784480, -106.821876′, and accessed from Aspen Mountain Road. The land on which the mine is located is publicly owned and is managed by the USFS. It is within the Aspen Mountain ski resort

Fred Wilson, representing the operator, Aspen Mountain Mining Corporation, was present at the time of the inspection.

There was no evidence of any recent mining at the site, and no activity besides maintenance and upkeep of the structures. The wooden cabin was locked. The mine portal was secured behind a locked steel door. The roof of the covered rail track leading to the portal had been repaired since the last inspection.

The Division holds a financial warranty of \$25,900 for the site, which is adequate at this time.




Figure 1: Screenshot of inspection map showing access to Compromise Mine




Figure 10: Blocked portion of portal entrance, adjacent to tunnel
