COMMENTS

This was a partial inspection of the Williams Fork Mines, permit number C-1981-044. I, Jared Ebert with the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (DRMS or Division) conducted the inspection. Mrs. Miranda Kawcak accompanied me during the inspection.

Maintenance items are noted in bold text.

BACKFILL and GRADING - Rule 4.14

Contemporaneous Reclamation 4.14.1; Approximate Original Contour 4.14.2; Highwall Elimination 4.14.1(2)(f); Steep Slopes 4.14.2, 4.27; Handling of Acid and Toxic Materials 4.14.3; Stabilization of Rills and Gullies 4.14.6:

The #5A Portal Area was observed. The slope above impoundment 5A-P1 has a few rills beginning to form where the vegetation is not well established. SPL will need to monitor this area and conduct repairs if necessary. It should be noted there had been significant rainfall in the area prior to the inspection.

Impoundment 9-P8 was observed. The pond was dry. The primary and emergency spillway was clear and functional. The pond embankment is stable and vegetated.

Impoundment 9-P6 was observed. The pond was dry. The primary spillway was closed but appeared functional.

Impoundment 9-P1 was observed. The pond was dry. The embankment was stable, but a large patch of knapweed was observed on the interior pond slopes. SPL will need to treat this area with a appropriate herbicide.

Impoundment 9-P4 was observed. The pond was dry. The primary spillway was closed but appeared functional.

Impoundment 5A-P1 was observed. The pond was dry. The primary spillway was closed but appeared functional.

PROCESSING WASTE/COAL MINE WASTE PILES – Rule 4.10 and 4.11 Drainage Control; Surface Stabilization; Placement:

The coal refuse disposal area was observed. This area was stable and vegetated. A patch of knapweed was observed near the northeast end of the pile (see the figure below for the location of the knapweed patch). This area will need to be treated with an appropriate herbicide.

The reclamation of this area appears to be progressing well, and the area is actively being utilized to produce hay. Equipment was observed onsite to facilitate the hay operation, and a stack of hay bales was observed.




Figure 9. Mine entrance sign with faded DRMS permit number.
