OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Leslie Jakoby, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Crader Gravel Pit is located on the southeast end of Durango and is accessed from Hwy 160. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 37.9 permitted acres. Pursuant to Rule 4.1.2, a financial warranty is not required for this site because the Operator is a unit of municipal or county government or the State Department of Transportation.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by berms, posts and signs that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

Mining is still occurring in the Phase 1 area. The pit walls are approximately 40 feet high with most of the slopes left between 1-2H:1V. No stability or erosional concerns were noted. Hauling was occurring during this inspection. Processed gravel stockpiles are located within the pit and above the pit in the east part of the Phase 2 and 3 areas.

The sand storage shed approved through TR4 has been constructed.

Mining at the site has not exposed groundwater. No problems related to stormwater or erosion control were noted.

Overall, the operation appears to be in general compliance with the approved Mine Plan.

There was no processing waste observed on site.

The operation has not exposed acid or toxic forming materials. Fuels were not stored on site.

Explosives are not used by the operation.

Noxious weed infestations were not observed.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
