OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Jim Greer, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Greer Pit is located approximately 2.7 miles west of Marvel and accessed from CR 100. The site is a 110c operation that includes a total of 8.3 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$12,721.00 for this site. The Division will review the reclamation costs to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan. The Operator will be notified under separate cover if the Division determines that the current financial warranty amount is insufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

The affected area was marked by fencing and berms that were clearly visible and adequate to delineate the affected area boundary.

Nearly the entire permit area has been disturbed by the mining operation. Mining will now continue downward to extract the remaining gravel. The highwall on the east side has been backfilled and graded to 3H:1V. Vegetation is well established on this slope. Backfilling of the south highwall is underway. The slope was at an approximate 1H:1V grade at the time of this inspection. The highwall on the west end of the pit has been reduced to 3H:1V. The west end of the pit will eventually daylight to the west. There is no highwall on the north side of the pit. Overburden and topsoil are stockpiled in berms above the highwalls. Crushed gravel stockpiles are located on the pit floor.

No stability or erosional concerns were noted.

Mining at the site has not exposed groundwater. No problems related to stormwater or erosion control were noted.

Overall, the operation appears to be in general compliance with the approved Mine Plan.

There was no processing waste observed on site.

The operation has not exposed acid or toxic forming materials. Fuels were not stored on site.

Explosives are not used for the operation.

Noxious weed infestations were not observed.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
