OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Jim Greer, representing the Operator, was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The Red Mesa Pit is located approximately 3.2 miles west of Marvel and accessed from CR 100, through the Greer Pit (M-1981-115). The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 12.6 permitted acres. Through AR-1, approved November 23, 2011, 12.4 acres were released from the west side of the then 25-acre permit area, for a wetland mitigation project related to the Long Hollow Reservoir Project. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$74,000 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan and determined that the current financial warranty amount is sufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site from CR 100.

Mining was not active during this inspection. Mining equipment was not noted on site. Other than crushed materials stockpiles located on site, mine related disturbance is minimal. Topsoil has been stockpiled on the southern permit boundary. The stockpile is vegetated and stable.

No stability or erosional concerns were noted.

Mining at the site has not exposed groundwater. No problems related to stormwater or erosion control were noted.

Overall, the operation appears to be in general compliance with the approved Mine Plan.

There was no processing waste observed on site.

The operation has not exposed acid or toxic forming materials. Fuels were not stored on site.

Explosives are not used by the operation.

Noxious weed infestations were not observed.

No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
