The following inspection topics were identified as having Problems or Possible Violations. INSPECTION TOPIC: Revegetation

PROBLEM: Russian olive trees and Russian knapweed are present within or have volunteered into the permit area and are becoming established. This is a problem for failure to employ weed control methods for a state listed noxious weed species within the permitted area, and to reduce the spread of weeds to nearby areas as required by Section 3.1.10 (6) of the rule.

CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: The operator shall implement the existing weed control measures approved in Technical Revision #3 by use of an herbicide and mechanical measures in accordance with Section 3.1.10 (6) of the Rule.

CORRECTIVE ACTION DUE DATE: 11/14/25

OBSERVATIONS

The Baseline Resource permit was inspected on August 21, 2025, by Chris Girardi with the Division of Reclamation, Mining, and Safety ("DRMS" or "Division"). The inspection was completed in response to Acreage Reduction and Surety Reduction requests submitted by the Hall-Irwin Aggregates, LLC (Operator). Damon Zuetell represented the Operator during the inspection. Carl Eichberger, the landowner, was also present. The weather was clear and sunny.

The Baseline Resource permit is a 112c sand and gravel operation that consists of 209.6 acres and is located on the northern side of Brighton, CO. The approved post-mining land use is developed water resources. The current land use surrounding the site is a mixture of industrial, commercial, agricultural, and residential. The site was accessed from a gate along County Road 23 1/2. Th mine identification sign was observed at the mine entrance in compliance with Rule 3.1.12. The Division inspected the areas in the northern portion of the permit area designated as Area A and the Walker North Lot C area as shown on the mining and reclamation plan maps. The permit contains lined reservoirs approved by the State Engineer's Office (SEO). The permit has been in final reclamation for several years, with all overburden and topsoil stockpiles having been removed or replaced, and all reservoir shorelines having been graded. In September 2021, the areas above the reservoir water line were seeded and mulched. The permit area was subsequently inspected in 2021 and 2023 by the Division.

On July 29, 2025, the Operator submitted an Acreage Reduction (AR-3) for partial release of the permit area in accordance with Rule 4.17.1. The Operator also submitted a Surety Reduction (SR-6) application for a reduction in the reclamation bond held by the Division in accordance with Rule 4.14.1. The Division conducted this inspection in accordance with Rule 4.17.2(2). The requested acreage reduction (release area) is 37.804 acres. This area consists of the entirety of Area A, which is 27.90 acres of a lake and surrounding shoreline areas, and 9.904 acres of land east of the Walker North Lot C reservoir. The Walker North Lot C reservoir was in stable condition, with the side slopes having been graded to a 3:1 horizontal to vertical configuration. The slopes were covered in vegetation, including some woody species, grasses, and annual weeds (see Photos 3-4).

The small area east of the Walker North Lot C area that has been requested for release is flat with thick, vegetative cover. The Operator stated the area was drill seeded in 2021 and 2023. Straw was also used as a soil amendment after seeding. However, the vegetation is dominated by a cover of annual weeds, namely Kochia, Cheatgrass, and Curled dock (see Photos 1-2). The reclamation seed mix consists of predominantly Western wheatgrass, Green needlegrass, Indian ricegrass, and a few Bluestem species. A few spots were barren and did not contain any annual weeds or reclamation grasses. If the reclamation seed mix species are growing under the cover of the annual weeds, it was not observable during this inspection. The Division noted that mowing would be beneficial in this area, and potentially an alternate seed mix.

The 27.90-acre area designated as Area A that also has been requested for release contains a lake with flat shorelines (see Photo 8-11). This area also contains a permanent access road on the southern side. PVP pipes marked the eastern permit boundary in this area. Much of the shoreline is dominated by Narrowleaf willow and other wetland species. 1.8 acres are reserved as a recreation as area for RVs and boats (see Photo 9). The Division notes that the reseeding in this area is moderately established in some patches but still will require additional seeding before release for some areas (see Photos 5-8). Seeding conducted on adjacent to the

north and south of the access road yielded little to no establishment of the reclamation seed mix (see Photos 6-8). North of the recreation area, the lake shoreline exhibited good coverage of grasses (see Photos 11-12) and will not require additional seeding events.

A minor amount of Kochia and Curled dock was observed within Area A. A few Russian olive trees were observed along the northern lake shoreline, to which the landowner committed to removing (see Photo 11). Russian thistle and Russian knapweed were observed along the eastern shoreline as well (see Photo 10). This is cited as a problem at the beginning of this report. Russian knapweed and Russian olive are List B Noxious weeds and need to be eradicated immediately through the application of an herbicide as approved in Technical Revision #3 in 2021.

AR-3 and SR-6 Release Decision: After conducting this inspection, the Division determined the requested 37.804-acre release area has not been reclaimed according to the approved reclamation plan. AR-3 and SR-6 will be denied in accordance with Rule 4.17.2(4). The Division notes that consultation with Weld County and/or the CSU Extension Service may be warranted to determine if an alternative seed mix or soil amendment(s) would facilitate better revegetation success.

The Division currently holds a reclamation bond in the amount of \$75,380 for this operation. The Division has evaluated the reclamation liability for the site and determined that the current reclamation bond is adequate. This concludes the Division's inspection report. 
