OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) normal monitoring program. The Spring Creek Gravel Pit is a 112c permitted site that includes a total of 18.8 permitted acres. The site is located eight miles southeast of Rangely, Colorado and is accessed from County Road 122. The pit is on property owned by the Bureau of Land Management; no representative was present for the inspection. Clint Chappell represented the operator and accompanied Amy Yeldell of the Division on the inspection. No financial warranty is held for this site as is it operated by Rio Blanco County, per Rule 4.1.2(2).

A mine sign was posted at the entrance to the mine site as required by Rule 3.1.12(1). The information depicted was correct/up to date and the sign was of sufficient size. The permit boundary of the affected land was clearly delineated pursuant to Rule 3.1.12(2).

This pit has a very long access road off of the ridge down into the draw. A gate is located at the top off of CR 122. The access road is prone to rock fall and access may be restricted based on weather or season. During the inspection some minor rock fall was observed on the road, but it did not hinder an inspection.

Based on its remoteness this pit is infrequently used. Only screening operations take place, no crushing occurs within the pit. The last processing took place approximate 3-4 yrs ago. No processing equipment, structures, fuel, etc. are stored on site. Two small stockpiles are present on site. Mining is moving east. One bench is present about 30 feet up. Material is knocked down from the top of the ridge periodically then the mountainside is mined back.

Overall the site is kept in good working order. Stormwater controls are properly employed with no signs of erosion. Little to no weeds were observed. Native vegetation has volunteered in some areas. No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
