## **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted as part of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) normal monitoring program. The Red Wash Gravel Pit is a 110c permitted site that includes a total of 9.9 permitted acres. The site is located 16 miles south of Rangely, Colorado and is accessed from Rio Blanco County Road 111. The pit is on property owned by the Bureau of Land Management, no representative was present for the inspection. Clint Chappell represented the operator and accompanied Amy Yeldell of the Division on the inspection. No financial warranty is held for this site as is it operated by Rio Blanco County, per Rule 4.1.2(2).

A mine sign was posted at the entrance to the mine site as required by Rule 3.1.12(1). The information depicted was correct/up to date and the sign was of sufficient size. The permit boundary of the affected land was clearly delineated pursuant to Rule 3.1.12(2). There is a gate located on the south side of the pit which grants access to the top of the cut located along the west side. Access to the east side of the pit cannot be restricted as it is adjacent to the county road.

The site was active over the summer. Rather than mining benches on the hillside the operation is now taking the top off layer by layer and then pushing down to process material. This is a safer and more efficient way to remove the material. Grizzly bars were located on the east side of the pit adjacent to the county road. No other processing equipment, structures, fuel, etc. are stored on site. A stockpile of screened material is located on the east side of the pit. A large pile of crushed material is located in the middle of the pit adjacent to the processing area. There are two active highwalls both of which appear stable.

Overall the site is kept in good working order. Little to no weeds were observed. Native vegetation has volunteered in some areas. No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
