OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. A representative for the operator was not present. Photographs are included with this report to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The AGRI-DLD Gravel Pit is located approximately 9.5 miles southeast of Durango and accessed from CR 307. The site is a 112c operation that includes a total of 156.27 permitted acres. The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$230,203.00. The Division will review the reclamation costs to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan. The Operator will be notified under separate cover if the Division determines that the current financial warranty amount is insufficient.

Adequate mine identification signage was noted at the entrance to the site.

Approximately 27 acres are currently disturbed at the site. The disturbance area is currently within the Phase 1-3 areas. Mining is progressing from east to west. The highwall in the north end of the pit is approximately 20 feet in height and is sloughed to approximately 1H:1V. Stockpiles are located throughout the pit area. Mining equipment is stored on the east side of the pit. Overburden is stockpiled on the north side of the pit.

- There is a batch plant located in the Phase 1 "Staging Area". The batch plant was operating during this inspection.
- No stability or erosional concerns were noted.
- Mining at the site has not exposed groundwater. No problems related to stormwater or erosion control were noted.
- Overall, the operation appears to be in general compliance with the approved Mine Plan.
- There was no processing waste observed on site.
- The operation has not exposed acid or toxic forming materials. Fuels were stored on site in appropriate containers.
- Explosives are not used by the operation.
- Noxious weed infestations were not observed.
- No problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
