OBSERVATIONS

This inspection is part of the normal monitoring program established by the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining, and Safety (Division). The BLM/ West End Gravel Pit is a 112c permitted site located east of the Nucla Airport in Western Colorado. Jeff Jeffries and Bobby Reeder, representatives for Montrose County accompanied the inspector on site.

The mine identification sign is in place and in compliance with Rule 3.1.12. The sign is located at the entrance to the site. Permit boundaries were noted as fencing along the perimeters.

The site is active. Several pieces of heavy equipment were noted on site. Numerous stockpiles of processed materials were located throughout the pit area. A hot mix plant is set up on site but has not been used recently. The plant is approved within the mining plan.

Stormwater appears to be being contained on site. No erosion or sedimentation issues were observed.

Preliminary reclamation work has begun in the southwest section of Phase 1. Overburden has been placed over the area but not final grading. Topsoil appears to have been spotted though out the area but not spread. There is some discussion of needing some of the overburden in the area for an airport project. If the material is needed the operator needs to re-stockpile as much of the topsoil as possible prior to excavation.

No fuel storage issues or other hazardous materials were observed. No on-site mining related debris is documented.

The Annual Report submitted on 03/25/2011 reflects current site disturbances and activities. The 2012 draft was reviewed and appears accurate as well.

The inspector observed no problems or violations at this time.

The financial warranty requirement is not applicable to local government agencies and therefore not reviewed.
