RE:

Based on your comments during the April 17, 2012 site visit, where you indicated that you were concerned about re-establishment of vegetative cover on the high wall areas....PSCM has prepared the following response.

- Pursuant to Rule 3.1.10(1)... "In those areas where revegetation is part of the Reclamation Plan, land shall be revegetated in such a way as to establish a diverse, effective, and long-lasting vegetative cover that is capable of self-regeneration, without continued dependence on irrigation, soil amendments or fertilizer, and is at least equal in extent of cover to the natural vegetation of the surrounding area.
 Response:
- 1) PSCM will replace the salvage growth medium on <u>all areas</u> where equipment can work safely (i.e. slopes flatter than 2H:1V). Where possible to be conducted in a safe manner, growth medium fines will be pushed off the crest of the pit to attempt to provide small micro-areas to allow seeds to germinate.
- 2) <u>All disturbed areas</u>, including the highwalls, will be reseeded. It is anticipated that broad-cast seeding will be the method used to reseed the disturbance area.
- 3) This approach will allow the revegetation to establish cover that is at least equal to the cover of the natural vegetation of the surrounding area in compliance with Rule 3.1.10(1).
