The following inspection topics were identified as having Problems or Possible Violations. INSPECTION TOPIC: Revegetation

PROBLEM/POSSIBLE VIOLATION: Problem: Premature grazing by horses has significantly reduced the success of revegetation at the site.

CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: Per Rule 3.1.10(4) the operator must restrict grazing during the initial establishment of vegetation. DRMS staff, in consultation with the landowner and the local soil conservation district, if any, shall determine when grazing my start. At this time grazing shall be restricted to allow for long term vegetation establishment at the property owned by Mr. McCurter. Documentation along with photographs that demonstrate the horses and mules have been restricted from the permitted site must be submitted to this office no later than May 14, 2012. Also the operator is advised to send the landowner documentation that states that grazing is not allowed inside the permit area at this time and copy this office of any such correspondence.

OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the normal monitoring program established by the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety. The Pit 500 is located off of Highway 141 approximately 0.5 miles south of Whitewater, Colorado. The Pit 500 is a multi phase operation that consists of two separate locations that are divided by the Gunnison River. The purpose of the April 10, 2012 inspection was to assess the success of the reclamation success in Stage 2 - Part B to and determine if the reclamation was completed according to what is required in the approved reclamation plan. Mark Gardner of Whitewater Building Materials Corp. along with associates accompanied the inspector during the inspection.

Conditions Observed in Stage 2 – Part B – This Portion of the permitted area is owned by James McCurter. All sloping appeared to be no steeper than the required 3H:1V. The majority of the area appeared to have adequate topsoil. The water inlet features that were considered an erosional issue during the previous inspection have been repaired and appear to be stable. A horse and a mule were observed within the permit area and appear to be compromising the success of revegetation. It appears that the animals grazing in the permitted area is delaying the reclamation success and negating the efforts for final reclamation put in by Whitewater. Please see photos of over grazed bare areas included with this report. Also, the area located between the eastern road and the Gunnison River appears to consist primarily of annual weeds and has very limited desirable perennial grass species established. The operator is required establish long term vegetation in the corridor between the Gunnison River and the road.

Due to the lack of adequate vegetation the release request cannot be approved at this time. The operator must restrict grazing of the permitted area until long term vegetation establishment is achieved.

This inspection was focused primarily on the reclamation release request and other components of the mining operation were not formally addressed during the inspection.
