### **GENERAL INSPECTION TOPICS**

This list identifies the environmental and permit parameters inspected and gives a categorical evaluation of each. No problems or possible violations were noted during the inspection. The mine operation was found to be in full compliance with Mineral Rules and Regulations of the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Board for the Extraction of Construction Materials and/or for Hard Rock, Metal and Designated Mining Operations. Any person engaged in any mining operation shall notify the office of any failure or imminent failure, as soon as reasonably practicable after such person has knowledge of such condition or of any impoundment, embankment, or slope that poses a reasonable potential for danger to any persons or property or to the environment; or any environmental protection facility designed to contain or control chemicals or waste which are acid or toxic-forming, as identified in the permit.

#### **OBSERVATIONS**

This was a partial inspection by the Division for purposes of reviewing reclamation work that has been performed by the operator, so that a correct bond amount may be estimated. Several new reclamation items were added to the reclamation tasks under Amendment AM-3, but the operator wishes to have other reclamation items deleted from the reclamation tasks since they have been completed. These changes will be reflected in the Division's decision for the bond reduction request (SR-2).

Phillip Kibel and Andy Hill from Denison's Egnar office were present during the inspection.

The bond reduction request from Denison described several specific items that had been completed: east shop building and its two attachments (superstructures) removed; small compressor building (superstructure) removed; vent shafts closed and sites graded (S-5); certain metal "boneyard junk" items removed; low grade pile removed; compressor building and slab (near SJ-1) removed. The Division inspected each feature included in the request and found most of them were completed as reported. The few exceptions to the items listed are: there is about 30 cubic yards of material remaining in the low grade pile; one of the metal culverts described and photographed north of the waste rock dump still remains onsite; vent shaft S-3 still remains open.

These observations will be incorporated into the Division's bond adjustment and reduction request approval. These will be sent under separate cover.

There were no other items inspected at this time. The Division appreciates the reclamation work performed by the operator.
