Thank you for your correspondence dated June 15, 2012 (received by our office on June 19, 2012) regarding the subject project.

A search of the Colorado Cultural Resource Inventory database indicated that at least one cultural resource inventory has been conducted in the vicinity of the proposed permit area, however no historic properties have been recorded therein. Our files contain incomplete information for this area, as most of Colorado has not yet been inventoried for cultural resources. As a result, there is the possibility that as yet unidentified cultural resources exist within the proposed permit area.

Should human remains be discovered during mining activities, the requirements under State law CRS 24-80 part 13 apply and must be followed.
