OBSERVATIONS

This was a mineral prospecting inspection performed by the Division as part of its monitoring of NOI sites. The operator named on page one was present throughout the inspection. Others that were present and representing the operator included James Williams, John Trujillo and John Bettridge. Also present and representing the Division was Russ Means.

The site was active at the time of the inspection. The approved plan for the prospecting project includes the rehabilitation of the surface structures and underground workings (but no extensions of the workings) and drilling numerous drill holes from drill pads in upland locations. Surface drilling has not begun, as of the date of the inspection. Crews were observed to be engaged in various tasks related to surface structures and the underground workings. That included the Revenue Portal and Revenue Tunnel, portal shed extending to mine office and locomotive shop, equipment shop portal, development rock dump structure, electric supply transformers, generator building and dry room. The profile of the new underground shop portal was painted on a cleared area of competent outcropping rock, in the location approved in the NOI plan. No drilling had begun, as of the date of this inspection.

A small grizzly was onsite, segregating clean development rock to be used for ballast underground or placed in the approved stockpile location. There was a one-half acre laydown area that contained new rail, ties, timbers, pipe and muckers. Heavy equipment onsite included wheeled loader, tracked loader, dozer, drill jumbo, man lift, and excavator.

Old and deteriorated construction- and mining-related materials were being set aside to be disposed of (such as old wood to be burned) or removed from the site (either hauled away as trash or as salvage metal).

The existing pile of low grade ore was present on the waste rock dump adjacent to the pond. No evidence of oxidation, staining or leaching was observed on or around this old pile.

The locations of the surface water sampling program were visited. They are placed so as to separately monitor the water quality of different contributors to Sneffels Creek, including water originating on this site. The operator has collected several quarters of data. Sampling will continue quarterly, with results forwarded to this office.

No further areas were inspected. The site is orderly and there were no problems noted. This office appreciates the cooperation shown by this operator.
