INSPECTION TOPIC: Financial Warranty

PROBLEM/POSSIBLE VIOLATION: Problem: The financial warranty is not adequate to reclaim the site in accordance with the approved reclamation plan. This is a failure to maintain the proper financial warranty amount to complete reclamation of the affected lands pursuant to C.R.S. 34-32-117(4)(b) of the Act.

CORRECTIVE ACTIONS: The operator shall submit adequate financial warranty, as determined by the Division. The Division will be sending a separate surety increase notice to the operator regarding the increase of the financial warranty. The operator will have 60 days from the date on the surety increase notice to post the additional financial warranty.

CORRECTIVE ACTION DUE DATE: 10/23/12

OBSERVATIONS

This inspection was conducted as part of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety's (Division) normal monitoring program. Jake Wilkinson, representing the operator was present during this inspection. Photographs are included with this report in order to illustrate some of the conditions observed.

The site is located approximately 16 miles east of Gunnison. Directions to the site are as follows:

- 1. From CR76 at (38.521879°, -106.667623°)
- 2. Turn onto CR44 and go southeast 1.1 miles to (38.507293°, -106.663938°)
- 3. Turn east onto CR 802A and go .7 miles to (38.502672°, -106.653766°)
- 4. Veer left and go .1 miles to (38.502775°, -106.652183°)
- 5. Turn left onto CR 802 and go east 2.1 miles to (38.516890°, -106.620560°)
- 6. Turn left and go north .1 miles to (38.518031°, -106.620924°)
- 7. Veer left and continue north 1.7 miles to (38.538592°, -106.626345°)
- 8. Turn left and go .1 mile to (38.539736°, -106.625564°)
- 9. Stay left and go .2 miles to (38.539929°, -106.628124°)
- 10. Stay right and go .2 miles to site at (38.541480°, -106.626470°)

There is alternate access from CR76 available, through private property, at 38.544059°, -106.644403°.

The Division currently holds a financial warranty amount of \$1,919.00 for this site. The Division has reviewed the reclamation costs, in order to ensure the financial warranty reflects the actual current cost of fulfilling the requirements of the Reclamation Plan, and determined that the current financial warranty amount is insufficient. The Operator will be notified under separate cover of a financial warranty increase.

Adequate mine identification signage was located inside the portal entrance, behind the steel grating.

The affected area boundary was adequately marked by corner posts.

The site consists of a headwall cut into the west slope of the hill, where a grated portal is located. A flat bench area is located just outside the portal.

The site was free of debris and noxious weeds.

No stability, erosion or sedimentation concerns were noted. Overall, the site appears to be in good order.

No other problems or violations were noted during this inspection.
