COMMENTS

An aerial inspection was conducted at the Trapper Mine; DRMS Permit No. C-1981-010. Mr. Harry Ranney of the Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety (Division) conducted the inspection. I, Jared Ebert with the Division narrated this report and annotated the photos.

The Division is aware the Operator will be submitting a Permit Revision to expand the mine site to the east of the current permitted area. In preparation for this revision, Harry Ranney was requested to take aerial photos of the current mining operation and the land to the east of the current permit area where Trapper has indicated the mine will expand.


The draglines appear to be mining in the K dip and strike pits.






East Pyeatt re-established drainage north of life of mine road near Parcels A-B-98 and A-B-96. Channel appears incised.


