Dear Mr. Means,

After careful consideration, and due to Gold Eagle Mining's current inability to fully access the properties listed above pending the outcome of the Department of Energy's (DOE) ongoing Preliminary Environment Impact Assessment (PEIS), we have determined the following course of action. Because the propeties are not available for full access in order to properly conduct the studies necessary to fully develop EPP's; and because these mines are not currently active operations, we intend to initiate the reclamation process for all of the above-captioned sites in accordance with the reclamation plans on file with DMRS. Since the DOE prohibits activity on the sites until the issueance of its PEIS, reclamation will begin after the DOE's release of the PEIS, and a full understanding of DOE's finding (this pending any subsequent litigation by intervening parties as a result of DOE's PEIS).

In additon to the initiation of the reclamation process, the above-listed mines and Permits will be placed on Temporary Cessation since active operations have ceased. Accordingly, Notices of Temporary Cessation will be issued within the next 30 days, including the information required by the Rules in this regard.
