Reference is made to the above-mentioned project located at 39.31626; -102.69816m Kit Carson County, Colorado.

This project has been reviewed in accordance with Section 404 of the Clean Water Act under which the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers regulates the discharge of dredged and fill material, and any excavation activity associated with a dredge and fill project in waters of the United States.

Based on the information provided, a Department of the Army (DA) Permit will not be required for this project. Although a DA Permit will not be required for the project, this does not eliminate the requirement that other applicable federal, state, and local permits be obtained as needed.

Thank you for your correspondence dated January 9, 2013 (received by our office on January 14, 2013) regarding the subject project.

A search of the Colorado Cultural Resource Inventory database indicated that no cultural resource inventories have been conducted in the vicinity of the proposed permit area, and no historic properties have been recorded therein. Our files contain incomplete information for this area, as most of Colorado has not yet been inventoried for cultural resources. As a result, there is the possibility that as yet unidentified cultural resources exist within the proposed permit area.

Should human remains be discovered during mining activities, the requirements under State law CRS 24-80 part 13 apply and must be followed.
