I would like to thank you for your phone time on January 14th. Please, for my file I would like to request a written response from you detailing what we discussed that day. To reiterate: you stated the fact that Wildcat Mining defined a direct board order and your office chooses not to issue a violation. Mike Thompson's letter to you, dated 12/21/12, denied what myself and other neighbors witnessed with the back-hoe plainly visible across the river working at the Mayday Mine site. Thus my complaint.

We also discussed that Wildcat Mining cannot use the illegal road for vehicular access until totally completed and approved. You stated that they cannot use the illegal road including its use for any planned construction next summer. Is that correct?

I have grave concerns that with Wildcat Mining's 7, or 8 years of continued violations that their operation is being monitored from the Grand Junction office and not the DRMS in Durango!

I would like to request that your response is sent in writing through the US mail, not through e-mail. I would also like any correspondence in the future between myself and/or Lisa Giovanniello with your office to be private and not privy to Wildcat Mining's owners, workers, or lawyers.
