#### **COMMENTS**

This was a partial inspection conducted by Zach Trujillo of Colorado Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety. Bobby Steele and Vince Massarotti of New Elk Coal Company accompanied myself on the inspection. The weather was cloudy with a light snow.

Most of Golden Eagle mine has been previously phase three bond released. The remainder of the mine site consists of a reclaimed ventilation shaft, pad and access roads.
