Thank you for your correspondence dated February 20, 2013 (received by our office on February 22, 2013) regarding the subject project.

A search of the Colorado Cultural Resource Inventory database indicated that no cultural resource inventories have been conducted in the vicinity of the proposed permit area, and no historic properties have been recorded therein. Our files contain incomplete information for this area, as most of Colorado has not yet been inventoried for cultural resources. As a result, there is the possibility that as yet unidentified cultural resources exist within the proposed permit area.

Should human remains be discovered during mining activities, the requirements under State law CRS 24-80 part 13 apply and must be followed.
