### **COMMENTS**

An aerial inspection of the New Horizon Mine was conducted by the Division on Friday, April 19, 2013. Photographs were taken by Harry Ranney and analyzed by Marcia Talvitie. Skies were clear.

Photographs included with this report begin at the southeastern corner of the permit area and proceed west-northwest. This arrangement generally follows the sequence of the mining operations that have taken place since 1993.

#### BACKFILL and GRADING - Rule 4.14

Contemporaneous Reclamation 4.14.1; Approximate Original Contour 4.14.2; Highwall Elimination 4.14.1(2)(f); Steep Slopes 4.14.2, 4.27; Handling of Acid and Toxic Materials 4.14.3; Stabilization of Rills and Gullies 4.14.6:

- Backfilling of the final pit is nearly complete on the Morgan property, and there is still material remaining in the Bench 1 "OB1" stockpile.
- A bulldozer was grading Bench 2 spoil east of (behind) the active pit on WFC's property.
- The boxcut spoil pile is located immediately southwest of the mine's surface facilities. It does not appear that any additional material has recently been taken from this pile for use in backfill operations.

#### EXPLOSIVES - Rule 4.08

Distance Prohibitions 4.08.4; Warnings 4.08.4; Control of Adverse Effects 4.08.4:

• The drill rig, which is operated by a contractor to the mine, appeared to be drilling a single row of holes along the face of the highwall on the WFC property.

#### HYDROLOGIC BALANCE - Rule 4.05

- During the March inspection, Ross Gubka said that water from the San Miguel River was scheduled to be diverted into the CCC Ditch on April 15, 2013.
- It did not appear that any reclaimed areas within the permit were being irrigated at the time of the inspection.
- Ponds are identified in blue text in the attached photos.
- Ponds 007, 008 and 013 were each impounding water at the time of the inspection.
- Ponds 009, 011, 012 and 015 were effectively dry.
- The reclaimed Krill and San Miguel drainages were clearly visible.

## GENERAL MINE PLAN COMPLANCE:

- The mine's shovel was parked and not in use at the time of the inspection, as were the three haul trucks, a motor grader, and two bulldozers.
- Active operations are nearing the far western end of the permit area, and mining at New Horizon is nearly complete. (In the attached photos, the permit boundary is shown in red.)
- Two small coal stockpiles had been built on the WFC property, east of the pit.

# REVEGETATION - Rule 4.15

Vegetative Cover; Timing:

• Although it did not appear that irrigation of the reclaimed lands (or the irrigated pasture reference area) had commenced for the season, those areas which have been irrigated previously were visibly greening-up, compared with the dryland pasture reclamation.

## SUPPORT FACILITIES - Rule 4.04:

• The mine's support facilities consist of offices, material and equipment storage, a heavy equipment shop, and fuel storage. All appears to be in order at the site.

## TOPSOIL – Rule 4.06

Removal 4.06.2; Substitute Materials 4.06.4(4); Storage and Protection 4.06.3; Redistribution 4.06.4:

• Topsoil stockpiles are scattered throughout the permit area, and are identified in green in the attached photographs.

## **ENFORCEMENT ACTIONS/COMPLIANCE**

No enforcement actions were issued as a result of this inspection, and none are pending.










