The Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety has completed its preliminary adequacy review of your 112c construction materials reclamation permit application. The application was received on April 12, 2013 and called complete for review on April 14, 2013. The decision date for this application is July 15, 2013. Please be advised that if you are unable to satisfactorily address any concerns identified in this review before the decision date, it will be your responsibility to request an extension of the review period. If there are outstanding issues that have not been adequately addressed prior to the end of the review period, and no extension has been requested, the Division may deny this application.

The review consisted of comparing the application content with specific requirements of Rule 3, 6.1, 6.2, and 6.4 of the Minerals Rules and Regulations of the Colorado Mined Land Reclamation Board for the Extraction of Construction Materials (Rule(s)). Any inadequacies are identified under the respective exhibit heading along with suggested actions to correct them.

6.4 SPECIFIC EXHIBIT REQUIREMENTS – REGULAR 112c OPERATIONS

The following items must be addressed by the applicant in order to satisfy the requirements of C.R.S. 34-32.5-101 et seq. and the Mineral Rules and Regulations of the Mined Land Reclamation Board:

6.4.4 EXHIBIT D – Mining Plan

1) While excavating, will a highwall be created? If so, please specify the maximum length and height the highwall will be at any given time during the operation. Please specify what angle the highwall will be (vertical, 1:1, 4:1 etc.).

2) Please describe what measures will be taken to ensure offsite areas are not disturbed by the mining operation.

6.4.5 EXHIBIT E – Reclamation Plan

- 3) Please describe how the seedbed will be prepared for seeding. Will the site be tilled to de-compact the soil?
- 4) Please provide a basis for the estimated volume to be used to backfill the pit slopes to a 4:1 horizontal to vertical ratio. What will be the maximum length and slope angle of the highwall at any given time during the operation?
- 5) Please state the Post Mining Land Use for the area once mining ceases.

6.4.13 EXHIBIT M- Other Permit and Licenses

6) Please inform the Division of how the Applicant will respond to the jurisdictional issues presented by the SHPO. See enclosure.

This concludes the Division's preliminary adequacy of your 112c permit application. The decision date of the application is July 15, 2013. As previously mentioned if you are unable to provide satisfactory responses to any inadequacies prior to this date, it will be your **responsibility to request an extension of time to allow for continued review of this application.** If there are still unresolved issues when the decision date arrives and no extension has been requested, the application may be denied.
