## **COMMENTS**

This was an inspection of the OC Mine #2 conducted by Brock Bowles of the Division of Reclamation, Mining and Safety. The permit was revoked and the reclamation bond was forfeited in 1995. Site reclamation was completed by the DRMS in 1996. In 2005, the DRMS observed excessive bare areas and that the revegetation had been overgrazed. In October 2006, the DRMS interseeded the site and contracted with the ranch foreman to repair the fence and conduct weed spraying. Additional fence repair was completed in 2011 with the coordination of Lowell Inmann, ranch manager.

The weather was sunny and warm and the ground was dry. The entrance gate was closed.

The portal area appears to be stable. There were no signs of slumping or cracking (photo 1).

The sediment pond was dry. The pond embankment was well vegetated and appeared to be stable (photo 2).

#### **RECLAMATION SUCCESS - Rule 4.15, Rule 3:**

The fence around the mine site was in good condition (photo 3). The gate was closed and a "Keep Gate Closed" sign was posted on the gate. No livestock was in the reclamation area. The vegetation looked very good throughout the area.

The vegetation looked very good (photo 4) and there were many species blooming including: snowberry, mules

Number of <u>Partial</u> Inspection this Fiscal Year: 1 Number of Complete Inspections this Fiscal Year: 2 ear, lupine, Lewis' flax, Wood's rose, Indian paintbrush, Rocky Mountain penstemon, yellow sweet clover, dandelion, choke cherry, sagebrush, rubber rabbitbrush, yellow salsify. pennycress, shepherd's purse, curly doc, houndstongue, green rabbitbrush, peavine, western stickseed, Scotch thistle, curlycup gumweed and Agoseris glauca. Many grass species were also noted including: smooth brome, Kentucky bluegrass, cheatgrass, orchard grass, western wheatgrass, bluebunch wheatgrass, Nelson's needlegrass and Letterman's needle grass.

The patch of Canada thistle that was noted in previous inspection reports located by the entrance gate on the south side of the road was not there this time. Lowell Inman of Castleton Ranch has been spraying the thistles. A couple of thistle rosettes were noted in the reclamation area but the number of plants was significantly decreased compared to previous inspections.

TOPSOIL – Rule 4.06 Removal 4.06.2; Substitute Materials 4.06.4(4); Storage and Protection 4.06.3; Redistribution 4.06.4:

The topsoil pile was well vegetated and had a topsoil sign marker in place (photo 5).
