Re: Wanakah Mine Notice of Intent, Permit No. P-2013-009

Dear Mr. Erickson,

Thank you for the opportunity to submit comments on the proposed Notice of Intent for the Wanakah Mine in Ouray County, Permit No. P-2013-010, a revision of an earlier NOI that was withdrawn. The Information Network for Responsible Mining (INFORM) is a Colorado-based citizens organization that advocates for responsible hardrock mining practices and protection of affected communities and the environment.

The Notice of Intent proposes the reopening of three portals but does not adequately discuss the potential for acid mine drainage or provide a detailed plan for how water quality will be monitored if it is produced during prospecting activities. An adequate plan should be in place. The current Notice of Intent is a scaled-back version of a previous exploration plan, which the Division determined was a Designated Mining Operation. Clearly the prospector's intent is to advance toward fully reopening the mine and will be required to submit an Environmental Protection Plan in the future, which would require this detailed planning.

As mining development activities progress, the operator should be required to address the existing waste piles and their potential for generating acid mine drainage. The Division should require geochemical analysis of the waste rock piles to determine the potential for generating acid from surface water at the site. According to the recent inspection report, the site has an "abundance of waste rock materials from the historic operation" and the prospector describes the

site as having "very limited surface access and extreme topography" in correspondence. As such, it is unlikely that disturbance to the historic waste piles can be entirely uncoupled from prospecting. There would be nothing wrong with addressing these issues and the overall site conditions early.
