### **GENERAL INSPECTION TOPICS**

#### **OBSERVATIONS**

This inspection was conducted in response to an Acreage Reduction request received by the Division of Reclamation, Mining, and Safety.

The operator is requesting release of four areas within the permit, totaling 11.5 acres.

The two areas first observed, furthest from the entrance to the site, are not adequate for release. These areas are essentially devoid of grasses and contain a fairly dense growth of Canada thistle. It was discussed that the County will be taking over the permit and plans to perform weed control in these areas.

The other two areas, proposed for release, are adequate for release from the permit. These include an undisturbed area consisting of pinion and junipers, and an area that has been graded and seeded with adequate grasses for reclamation.

The operator must complete the following prior to approval of the reduction request:

- 1. Submit notice that the two areas proposed for release that are not adequately reclaimed are being removed from the release request.
- 2. Submit a new map to the Division that depicts the proposed permit boundary after release of the areas adequately reclaimed. This map should clearly depict the resulting permit boundary that will remain at the site.

Since the landowner had concerns, relative to the areas proposed for release, the Division must receive notice from the landowner that they are satisfied with the areas being proposed for release. The operator should submit the map described above to the landowner for review, so that the landowner can comment on the proposed request.

The deadline for a decision, related to this request, is August 5, 2013. Therefore the above items must be completed and submitted to the Division to allow time for review before that deadline. Otherwise, the release request will be denied.
